Series: Fighting Truth Decay

Sermon: Trust Him

Jude 1:24-25

(Note: this is the 2nd set of discussion questions on Jude 1:24-25. If you missed the first set and want them, please contact the office.)

- 1. What is the significance of the way Jude 1:24, the final section of Jude's short letter, begins: "Now"?
- 2. Jude mentions that God is "able." What does this mean?
- 3. The first thing Jude says God is "able," concerns keeping believers from stumbling. Does this mean God keeps us from committing sin? If not, what does it mean?
- 4. The second thing Jude says God is "able," concerns make believers stand in the presence of His glory blameless and with great joy. Looking at the first part of this statement, what does it mean that God is able to make us stand? More importantly, what does it mean that God is able to make us stand "in the presence His glory?
- 5. What is "glory"?
- 6. How will we "stand" in His glory "blameless and with great joy""
- 7. Jude continues the main sentence begun with the words, "Now to Him...to the only God our Savior, through Jesus Christ our Lord, *be glory*, *majesty*, *dominion and authority* ..." Did He acquire or gain these qualities?
- 8. Notice the time conditions stamped on these qualities: "before all time and now and forever." What is the significance of the assertion made that He is "able" as it relates to this and the previous question?
- 9. "Amen" must be more than a dial-tone when finished praying. What does "Amen" mean and how is it the perfect close of Jude's doxological last words?
