Ephesians 2:1-10

1. Read Matthew 7:21-23. Read it, again. Now, which is a more certain evidence of God's saving power: performing miracles & prophesying or a godly life? Why is this significant?
2. What does Ephesians 2:1 mean by "dead?" Now, consider "sons of disobedience," "formerly lived in the lusts of our flesh," "children of wrath" and "even as the rest" with "dead." Describe WHAT this means and the EXTENT to which it means it.
3. Who are the three enemies named in Ephesians 2:1-3 and who do they operate together?
4. In verse three, the word "wrath" is used. What is wrath? In this case, whose wrath is meant? Describe why this wrath is deserved. (You may want to review the phrases listed in #2, as to their meaning, as it pertains to answering #4.)
5. According to Ephesians 2:3, what is the primary distinction of being lost? What is the significance of it being one's "nature?" (Again, consider the phrases mentioned in #2 when considering "nature.")
6. According to Ephesians 2:4-6, what are the three things God did? Look at those verses, again, and identify His motivation.
7. Why did God make us alive in verse seven?
8. What does Ephesians 2:8-10, especially verse 10, say a believer will be doing?
9. In light of this, culminating in Ephesians 2:10, re-read Matthew 7:21-23 and discuss the implications.
