**Daniel 1:1-21**

1. Why do you think persecuted Christians gravitate to the book of Daniel?
2. In the events of Daniel God is working even through the sins of His people. Where else in Scripture can we find God work despite or even through great sin?
3. Compare and contrast the scattering of God's people in Daniel 1 and Acts 8. How does God use each of these scenarios?
4. What does it mean to be defiled by the world? What defensive measures can you take to protect against being defiled? Is it possible to be too protective? Explain.
5. Approximately how old were Daniel and his three Hebrew friends at the time they were taken captive. What does their faithfulness and fortitude at their ages suggest about the potential maturity of young people? How were they so mature?
6. What was Babylon's goal and strategy for the young leaders they captured and brought to Babylon, described in Daniel chapter 1? How does this compare to the worlds' goal and strategy for indoctrinating people?
7. Read Daniel 1:2. What does it mean that The Lord did this? Why did He do it?
8. How does Pastor Robert's story about the 1980s USA Men's Hockey team relate to the maturity and resolve of Daniel and his three friends? How should it relate to us in our walk with Christ?
