Sermon: Dying to Live

Romans 6:1-14

1. Explain "Justification," "Sanctification" and "Glorification." What tense goes with each term? Identify the relationship of the term with "sin." Which term applies to Romans 6?
2. Explain Paul's question(s) in Romans 6:1. How does Paul's question connect with the idea: it is easier to ask forgiveness than permission? Also, can you think of the fancy word that starts with an "a" for this line of logic?
3. Explain how Paul uses the concept of "baptism" (not water baptism) to articulate our connection to Christ and forgiveness of sin, releasing the believer from sin's penalty. How can we be both dead and alive? Finally, how are we dead to live?
4. Describe the importance of these three words from the text of Romans 6:1-18: knowing, reckoning and presenting (or, knowing, considering and yielding). Is the importance of this list important? If so, how and why? What do these mean?
5. Read Romans 6:12-18. Can you remember the 3 things Pastor Robert mentioned as necessary from these verses, each starting with an "E?"
6. Having talked about all this, what are the answers to Paul's questions in Romans 6:1 and 6:15? What, according to Paul's explanation, is the suggestion of the question in 6:1, 15 preposterous?
7. What does it mean to be "slaves to righteousness" or "enslaved to God?"
8. Contrast Paul's expressions of being either a slave to sin or a slave to God.
