Sermon: The Big-Mouthed Little Horn
Daniel 8:1-27

1. An emphasis of this chapter is that God knows the future. What effects should this truth have on your daily life?
2. What are the 3 main images in Daniel 8 and who does Gabriel tell Daniel they are? Gabriel names two very specifically. Is the third the antichrist or an antichrist type? How do we know?
3. What do these verses reveal about each of the kingdoms represented, even the individuals? What characterizes them?
4. How does Daniel 8:15-17 relay God's desire for us to know His Word and His Word's meaning? How difficult can it be and what is necessary to ascertain His Word's meaning?
5. Recall that from Daniel 2:4 through the end of Daniel 7, the text is written in Aramaic, but reverts back to Hebrew at Daniel 8:1 through the end of the book. What was the purpose of the section written in Aramaic, who was the main audience? Has the main audience changed with Daniel 8:1? If so, who is it?
6. Based on your answer of the previous question, what is the significance of the audience being the Hebrews, not the church? Was the church even conceived of during the days of Daniel?
7. Compare the "little horns" of Daniel 7 and Daniel 8. Articulate the similarities, but also the differences (such as from what world power does each arise).
8. Read Daniel 7:27. Have you ever been overwhelmed by God's Word? If so, describe when and why.
